

Technology Access and Use Policy

The library provides public access to technology in support of our role as a community information and lifelong learning center. Since the computers are located in public areas shared by library users of all ages, backgrounds and sensibilities, individuals are asked to be considerate of others when accessing potentially controversial information. The library uses filtering software to comply with the Children's Internet Protection Act, but will disable filtering at the request of patrons 18 years and older. Parents and guardians are responsible for the Internet information selected and/or accessed by their children. Children who use the Internet unsupervised may be exposed to inappropriate or disturbing information and images. Parents are encouraged to monitor their children's use of the Internet.

Users agree to refrain from using the library computers for illegal or unethical purposes. Users agree to respect the rights of others by not misrepresenting themselves or attempting to modify or gain access to files, passwords, or data belonging to others or by transmitting threatening, harassing or abusive language or images. Users also agree to refrain from damaging or altering the setup of the equipment.

Violation of the above guidelines may result in suspension of technology use.
